Motives Are the Seeds of Action I Think Before I Do

In my early days of sobriety, my wife came home from an Alanon meeting all excited about what they had talked about. Apparently, they were discussing their Fourth Step inventories and she explained that when taking Step Six, it was important that she *examine her motives* before making decisions. How interesting and profound that statement was, at the time, and it has come up many, many times since that initial conversation. Since almost everything we do begins with what we think, that statement has been a big part of what I believe our goals are supposed to be when we are in the process of cleaning up the wreckage of the past. It also implies that we should examine our motives, for what we do, from this day forward, and be sure that they conform to the spirit of the principles that are suggested in the A.A. program.

This kind of thinking was foreign to me before John Barleycorn got his grip, but when the alcohol took its toll and I was circling the drain, I was forced to decide what I was going to do with the rest of my life. It became very important to learn and understand what the causes of my failures were, and what I could do to correct them. Like most of us, I measured my successes and failures based on things I had accomplished, by the things I owned, and where I lived. It made little difference how I acquired those things. How different my thinking is today, compared to how it was back then. I no longer base my success on material possessions. As the old country song says, "one rich man in ten with a satisfied mind." This, to me, does not mean that we must take a vow of poverty. To me, this means that if I am honest with myself and my motives are pure and unselfish, I can be content at any economic level. My *motives* make it so.

(Motives, Continued)

I was doing a little research to find the definition of the word *happiness* and discovered that it is often described as "a byproduct of right living and not an end in itself" Happiness is not a goal, but it is the result of living right. A friend once shared at a meeting that, satisfying his wants will never make a person happy. Another person shared that she had read something that described it like this: "happiness is like a butterfly, the more you chase it, the farther away it gets, but when you stand still, it will land on your shoulder". If my motive is to create happiness, it's probably not going to happen. These subtle little gems of wisdom are revealed to me daily and they slowly become a part of my mental make-up.

Examining my motives has made me look deeper at many of the subtle little differences in the words we use and their causes and effects and, for my purposes, I find that my defects of character, *cause* my shortcomings, and when I understand my defect, my shortcoming (faulty behavior) can be corrected. When I understand the problem, the troubles can be corrected. These ideas may be hard to grasp in the beginning but if I hadn't started looking deeper into my motives, I may never have resolved the deeper issues. These days, Unselfish Motives are the seeds that all my thoughts and actions stem from, and that is as simple as it gets.

Attention Groups

At the January intergroup meeting, the business committee explained that Central Office has excess funds in its checking account. Guidelines say that when excess occurs, we need to present an action plan to lower the surplus.

We are looking to groups and members for ideas on how to achieve our goals of helping the alcoholic who still suffers. We know that the Business Committee does not know all ways to reach someone that needs our help and are looking to members for new ways to be there.

Here are some ideas presented, please add your ideas to list. Please use ASK picture icon (BELOW) on Intergroup website, ncsandiegoaa.org, to submit suggestions (select Business Committee for your feedback).

- 1. Purchase x number of Grapevine/La Vina subscriptions for North County physicians, clergy, mental health professionals, or others who come across people with drinking problems.
- 2. Host separate breakfast or lunch events for clergy, lawyers, doctors, military, mental health professionals, police, etc.
- 3. Underwrite the distribution of pertinent literature to school nurses/social workers/teachers, etc.
- 4. Distribute and regularly re-stock pamphlet distribution to non-profit health care clinics throughout North County. This might involve collaboration with the North County Spanish Central Office.
- 5. Contact the North County LGBTQ Center to get on the radar for PRIDE next year. I believe there is also a PRIDE event in Escondido, and possibly in other North County locations.
- 6. Place a communication in the READER, THE PAPER, COASTAL DISPATCH, MILITARY TIMES, and other publications are widely distributed in North County.
- 7. Central office speaker meeting with adjustments to make it more public information focused.
- 8. Meet with NSDYPAA to discuss getting young people involved in 12 step ideas and new ways to reach younger people.
- 9. Workshop to discuss safety in meetings for new members. This includes sexual advances as well as members taking advantage of financial issues of new people. Signs for old-timers notice and intervene.
- 10. Twelfth-Step workshop to have members learn and discuss service opportunities in AA.
